## What is Health Insurance?

Health insurance is a type of insurance that covers some or all your medical expenses.

# **Types of Insurance**

## **Employer-Sponsored**

Health insurance provided to employees and dependents by their employer.

#### Medicaid

In New Mexico, Medicaid is known as Turquoise Care. It provides federal and state funded health insurance to low-income individuals, including families and children, pregnant women, older adults, and people with disabilities. All Native Americans have the option to enroll in either Turquoise Care (managed care) or Fee-For-Service Medicaid.

#### Medicare

Federal health insurance for most people aged 65 or older and people under 65 years old with certain disabilities.

#### **BeWell**

New Mexico's health insurance marketplace helps people who **do not** qualify for employer-sponsored, Medicaid or Medicare shop and enroll in affordable, reliable health insurance. **Native Americans can enroll anytime during the year.** 

## What You Need to Apply for Health Insurance Through BeWell

- Dates of birth and social security numbers for anyone applying for insurance.
- Income information for everyone in the household.
- Information about job-related health insurance available to your family.
- Information about how you file your taxes.

# **How Does Health Insurance Help Native Americans?**

- Health insurance covers emergency and specialty care outside of Indian Health Service (IHS).
- It provides access to additional doctors outside of IHS.
- It pays IHS or tribal health clinics for care they provide to the community.
